The sale is subject to unpaid taxes and assessments, tax, water and sewer liens and other municipal assessments. The amount due can be obtained from the local taxing authority.

All interested parties are to conduct and rely upon their own independent investigation to ascertain whether or not any outstanding interest remain of record and/or have priority over the lien being foreclosed and, if so the current amount due thereon.

If the sale is set aside for any reason, the Purchaser at the sale shall be entitled only a return of the deposit paid. The Purchaser shall have no further recourse against the plaintiff, its successors and assigns or plaintiff's attorney(s).

Surplus Money: If after the sale and satisfaction of the mortgage debt, including costs and expenses, there remains any surplus money, the money will be deposited into the Superior Court Trust Fund and any person claiming the surplus, or any part thereof, may file a motion pursuant to Court Rules 4:64-3 and 4:57-2 stating the nature and extent of that person's claim and asking for an order directing payment of the surplus money. The Sheriff or other person conducting the sale will have information regarding the surplus, if any.

On January 12, 2024, Gov. Murphy signed legislation into state law establishing a Community Wealth Preservation Program to promote equity and fairness in foreclosure sales by providing new and greater opportunities for foreclosed-upon residents and their next of kin, tenants and other prospective owner-occupants, along with nonprofit community development corporations, to purchase and finance a foreclosed-upon home. The approximate good faith estimate of the upset price on the day of the Sheriff's Sale to be satisfied is the sum of \$291,066.11. The purchaser will be required to pay 20% deposit of the purchase price at the close of the sale in certified or cashier's check and sign a purchase acknowledgement in accordance with these conditions. The balance due within 10 days with lawful interest on the unpaid balance from the 11th day until paid in full. Those certified to participate in the Community Wealth Preservation Program, who shall occupy the property for at least 84 months shall pay a 3.5% deposit of the upset price at the close of the sale in certified or cashier's check and sign purchase acknowledgement in accordance with these conditions. The balance due within 60 business days and thereafter lawful interest on the unpaid balance until the 90th business day when full payment is due.

Sheriff's Deed delivered after full payment is made. Payment of interest will not remedy default in tendering balance due. Sheriff's fees and commissions are to be deducted from purchase price. Certified and Cashier's Checks should be payable to "Warren County Sheriff".
